
A period should end a sentence, not a girl's education.®

The Pad Project aims to achieve menstrual equity by combining pad machines with community partnerships, sexual and reproductive health education, and domestic advocacy work.

The organization began as a documentary project led by students and educators convinced that menstruation matters for everyone. That film, entitled Period. End of Sentence., won an Academy Award in 2019 and launched the project into the fully- fledged organization it is today.

Affordable menstrual hygiene products are not luxury items. They are a necessity.

The Pad Project works with local partners and nongovernmental organizations to install machines that are easy to operate, use locally-sourced natural resources to function, and require minimal electricity.

The Pad Project has placed six pad machines in different regions in India and implemented a washable pad program in Sierra Leone. We are working to install a semi-automated pad machine in Afghanistan and to launch washable pad programs in Ghana and Guatemala. We are combating period poverty in the U.S. by hosting menstrual donation drives and providing grassroots organizations with microgrants to purchase menstrual supplies. With your help, in 2021, we hope to place machines in India, Kenva, Nepal, and Sri Lanka and to launch washable pad programs in Kenya, Sierra Leone, and Uganda.
